
Welcome to Staffordshire University!

At Staffordshire University we are committed to promoting and enabling a positive culture where staff, students and visitors feel confident to be their authentic selves. We focus on inclusion as a way to ensure equality of opportunity for all our people and to demonstrate our commitment to Equality, Diversity and Human Rights. This commitment is reflected in our Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Statement and Framework, which underpin our course development and delivery.

The Student Inclusion Team provides specialist study support and a counselling service to support students who may experience issues that affect their mental wellbeing. The service provides a range of information, advice and facilities such as offering study needs assessments, help to apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) and providing study support services for students with dyslexia.

SUPPORT & GUIDANCE

We endeavour through our support systems to assist you in all relevant areas of your course – whether relating to professional, academic and/or personal development.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

All students at the University are allocated an Academic Mentor. Academic Mentors support the development of:

- Students' self-organised learning skills: by monitoring overall academic progress, working with the student and directing them to other services where further support is required
- Students' social capital: by supporting them to engage with the Students' Union, placements and network opportunities
- Students' resilience: by encouraging personal development and wellbeing, and signposting to other serviceswhere further support is required

You will also have access to the Academic Skills team, to help you develop essential skills such as academic writing, critical thinking and exam prep.
